

Bachelor of Science in Artificial Intelligence

Final examination regulations

The Bachelor of Science in Artificial Intelligence course regulations prescribe that the degree title is conferred after passing a final test consisting of redacting a report written by the student in English. The report must document a topic in the field of Artificial Intelligence explored in the practical-experimental teaching activities (stage or laboratories). A tutor, who must be a teacher responsible for an educational activity within the degree course, will supervise the student in preparing for the final exam.

The student will present the report and discuss its content with the members of the Degree Board on one of the dates approved by the Teaching Council. The Degree Board includes a minimum of three teachers of the three Universities, of which at least two must be responsible for courses taught in the Bachelor of Science in Artificial Intelligence. Tutors and co-tutors not part of the Board can participate without voting rights. The longest-serving professor of the highest category chairs the Degree Board.

Application

Students who want to take the final exam must apply at least one month before the date set for graduation by following the procedure described at the link <https://portale.unipv.it/it/didattica/corsi-di-laurea/studiare/laurearsi>.

One week before the graduation date, the student must upload the report's final version in the reserved area, encoded in the pdf/A format.

All exams must be finalized and recorded one week before the graduation day.

Final exam

In the final exam, the candidates present the content of their reports, possibly with the help of slides or other audiovisual materials prepared for the occasion. The presentation is public, and the candidates can invite family members and friends to attend. Each candidate will have **20 minutes** for the presentation and must leave some time to answer the Degree Board's questions. The candidates and the members of the Board must use the English language for the whole discussion. After the presentations, the chair of the Board will announce the final marks awarded to the candidates and confer the degree title.

Graduation mark

The maximum mark awarded for the degree is 110, possibly *cum laude* (with honors). The final mark is computed as the sum of a base score and an increment.

The base score is the average mark obtained for the exams or tests relating to teaching activities that entail a final grade, weighted by the number of associated credits, scaled by the factor $\frac{11}{3}$, and rounded to the nearest integer. The base score does not consider the outcome of exams relating to surplus activities.

The increment, which varies from a minimum of zero to a maximum of **seven points**, is assigned collegially by the Degree Board at the end of the exam. It is further increased by **two points** for students who obtain the qualification in progress, i.e., within the third academic year from the year of enrolment.

The Degree Board can award the mark *cum laude* (with honors) when the sum of the base score and the increase decided by the Commission is not less than 112/110. The awarding of honors requires the unanimous support of the Board.
